Jonah Crab – Stock Status

- No approved stock assessment for Jonah crab.
- FMP adopted in August 2015:
 - Limited the directed fishery participation for those with LTA or landings prior to control date of June 2, 2015.
 - Established a minimum size.
 - Prohibition of retaining egg-bearing females.
 - Established a bycatch limit.
 - Established a recreational possession limit.
- 3 subsequent addenda adopted to:
 - Clarify bycatch provision.
 - Develop standard for claw fishery.
 - Address harvester reporting and biological data collection.




Jonah Crab - Fishery Performance

• RI landings have increased more than five-fold since 1990.



- Mixed crustacean trap fishery for lobster and Jonah crab.
 - Jonah crab evolved from bycatch to target species.
- Highest landings in winter months (Dec to Mar).

Jonah Crab - 2020 Management



- <u>Issue:</u> Rule provides for a bycatch limit of 1,000 crabs/vessel/day and does not specify there has to be equal poundage of other species, which is inconsistent with the FMP.
- **<u>Proposal</u>**: Amend rule to address bycatch limit for consistency with the FMP.
- **Proposed Rule (Part 5, section 5.11(B)(4)(b)):** By gillnet or otter trawl (i.e., non-trap gear) Bycatch Provision: One thousand (1,000) crabs per vessel per calendar day provided the poundage of crabs does not exceed the poundage of other species on board the vessel at all times during a fishing trip.

Commercial Bluefish

- <u>Issue:</u> Current rule is problematic with language stating that 2nd sub-period ends on 2nd Saturday in November and 3rd sub-period starts on 2nd Sunday in November.
- **Proposal:** Modify this language to hard dates.
- Proposed Rule (Part 3, section 3.18.2(B):
 - 1. January 1 through April 30: One thousand (1,000) pounds per vessel per bi-week.
 - May 1 through second Saturday in November 15: Six thousand (6,000) pounds per vessel per week.
 - 3. <u>Second Sunday in November 16 through December 31:</u> Five hundred (500) pounds per vessel per week.
- <u>Note:</u> Proposed amendment is in conjunction with Part 1 amendment recently filed to address partial weekly and biweekly (aggregate) possession limits.

Groundfish – Recreational possession limits

- <u>American Plaice, Haddock, Pollock, Yellowtail flounder, and</u> <u>Witch flounder:</u> Delete current language regarding rec. possession limits and replace with "unlimited" for consistency with NOAA rules. Current language is identical for each of these species.
- <u>Proposed language:</u>
 - Possession Limit: Unlimited.
 - 1. There is no recreational possession limit for (insert species listed above) provided the vessel is fishing in state waters and does not have a federal permit authorizing the harvest of American plaice.
 - 2. Vessels in possession of a federal permit authorizing the recreational harvest of (insert species listed above) in federal waters may harvest American plaice in state waters in the amount equal to the federal regulations.
- <u>Cod:</u> Delete reference to CFR for minimum size and possession limit and replace with current minimum size (<u>21</u>") and possession limit (<u>10 fish/person/day</u>) as specified in NOAA rule.

Control Dates



- <u>Issue:</u> In instances where a control date has been established but there has been no rule put into effect (commercial Summer flounder, Horseshoe crab, Atlantic Rock Crab), clarify that the date specified in the rule has no current bearing but was established for potential future use in establishing eligibility criteria for future access to the fishery.
- **<u>Proposal</u>**: Add additional language to *existing* control dates to clarify purpose.
- **Proposed Language (3.10.2(G), 5.10(I), 5.12(A)):**

<u>This control date has been established by the Department</u> for potential future use in establishing eligibility criteria for future access to the fishery.
