NOTICE OF VIOLATION

A. Introduction

Pursuant to Sections 42-17.1-2(21) and 42-17.6-3 of the Rhode Island General Laws, as amended, ("R.I. Gen. Laws") you are hereby notified that the Director of the Department of Environmental Management (the "Director" of "DEM") has reasonable grounds to believe that the above-named party ("Respondent") has violated certain statutes and/or administrative regulations under DEM's jurisdiction.

B. <u>Facts</u>

- (1) The subject property is a dam identified as Georgiaville Pond Dam, State Identification Number 126, located north and west of Stillwater Road and east of Farnum Pike in the town of Smithfield, Rhode Island ("Dam 126").
- (2) The Respondent owns a portion of Dam 126.
- (3) Dam 126 is classified by DEM as High Hazard.
- (4) On May 20, 2010, Dam 126 was inspected. The inspection revealed that the crest of the embankment was lowered by six (6) feet.
- (5) In a certified letter from DEM to the Respondent dated April 25, 2012, which was delivered on June 8, 2012, DEM forwarded a registration form for Dam 126. The Respondent was required to complete and return the form to DEM by June 22, 2012.
- (6) DEM considers Dam 126 unsafe because of the lowered embankment crest.
- (7) As of the date of this Notice of Violation ("NOV"), the Respondent has not provided the registration form to DEM.

C. <u>Violation</u>

Based on the foregoing facts, the Director has reasonable grounds to believe that you have

violated the following statutes and/or regulations:

- (1) **DEM's Rules and Regulations for Dam Safety (the "Dam Safety Regulations"), Rule 4A** requiring the owner of a high hazard dam to maintain the dam in a safe condition
- (2) **DEM's Dam Safety Regulations, Rule 8** requiring the owner of a dam to provide a fully completed registration form to DEM
- D. <u>Order</u>

Based upon the violations alleged above and pursuant to R.I. Gen. Laws Section 42-17.1-2(21), you are hereby ORDERED to:

- (1) Within one hundred eighty (180) days of receipt of the NOV, retain a professional engineer fully registered in the State of Rhode Island, who is experienced with design, construction and repair, to submit an application to DEM in accordance with the Dam Safety Regulations, Rule 10B to repair the embankment for Dam 126, which must include a schedule to complete the work **OR** submit a report to DEM that demonstrates that there is no need to repair the embankment to maintain the dam in a safe condition.
- (2) The application, schedule, and/or report required in Section D.1 above shall be subject to DEM review and approval. Upon review, the DEM shall provide written notification to the Respondent either granting formal approval or stating the deficiencies therein. Within fourteen (14) days (unless a longer time is specified) of receiving a notification of deficiencies, the Respondent shall submit to the DEM a modified report, application, and/or schedule or additional information necessary to correct the deficiencies.
- (3) Commence work specified in the schedule approved by the DEM within twenty (20) days of approval (unless otherwise expressly authorized by the DEM in writing to commence work at a later time), and complete such work in accordance with the approved schedule.
- E. <u>Right to Administrative Hearing</u>
 - (1) Pursuant to R.I. Gen. Laws Chapters 42-17.1, 42-17.6, 42-17.7 and 42-35, each named respondent is entitled to request a hearing before the DEM Administrative Adjudication Division regarding the allegations and/or orders set forth in Sections B through D above. All requests for hearing MUST:
 - (a) Be in writing. <u>See</u> R.I. Gen. Laws Sections 42-17.1-2(21)(i) and 42-17.6-4(b);
 - (b) Be **RECEIVED** by DEM's Administrative Adjudication Division, at the following address, within twenty (20) days of your receipt of this NOV. See R.I. Gen. Laws Sections 42-17.1-2(21)(i) and 42-17.7-9:

- (c) Indicate whether you deny the alleged violations. <u>See</u> R.I. Gen. Laws Section 42-17.6-4(b); **AND**
- (d) State clearly and concisely the specific issues which are in dispute, the facts in support thereof and the relief sought or involved, if any. See Rule 7.00(b) of the DEM Administrative Rules of Practice and Procedure for the Administrative Adjudication Division of Environmental Matters.
- (2) A copy of each request for hearing must also be forwarded to:

- (3) Each named respondent has the right to be represented by legal counsel at all administrative proceedings relating to this matter.
- (4) Each respondent must file a separate and timely request for an administrative hearing before DEM's Administrative Adjudication Division as to each violation alleged in the written NOV. If any respondent fails to request a hearing in the above-described time or manner with regard to any violation set forth herein, then this NOV shall automatically become a Final Compliance Order enforceable in Superior Court as to that respondent and/or violation. See R.I. Gen. Laws Sections 42-17.1-2(21)(i) and (v) and 42-17.6-4(b) and (c).
- (5) This NOV does not preclude the Director from taking any additional enforcement action nor does it preclude any other local, state, or federal governmental entities from initiating enforcement actions based on the acts or omissions described herein.
