NOTICE OF VIOLATION

A. Introduction

Pursuant to Sections 42-17.1-2(21) and 42-17.6-3 of the Rhode Island General Laws, as amended, (“R.I. Gen. Laws”) you are hereby notified that the Director of the Department of Environmental Management (the “Director” of “DEM”) has reasonable grounds to believe that the above-named parties (“Respondents”) have violated certain statutes and/or administrative regulations under the DEM's jurisdiction.

B. Administrative History

On 23 September 2016 and 4 April 2017, the DEM notified PMG NORTHEAST LLC of the statutory deadline for the permanent closure of the underground storage tanks at the facility that is the subject of this Notice of Violation (“NOV”) and the actions required to keep the facility in compliance with the law and the Rhode Island Code of Regulations titled *Rules and Regulations for Underground Storage Facilities Used for Regulated Substances and Hazardous Materials (250-RICR-140-25-1)* (the “UST Regulations”). PMG NORTHEAST LLC failed to comply with the notices.

C. Facts

- (1) The property is located at 27 (a/k/a 35) Plainfield Street, Assessor's Plat 105, Lot 416 in the City of Providence, Rhode Island (the “Property”). The Property includes a convenience store, a motor fuel filling station and underground storage tanks (“USTs” or “tanks”) that were used for storage of petroleum products and are subject to the UST Regulations (the "Facility").
- (2) BLUE HILLS FUELS, LLC owns the Property.
- (3) PMG NORTHEAST LLC owns the USTs and operates the Facility.
- (4) The Facility is registered with the DEM and is identified as UST Facility No. 01064.

- (5) The USTs are registered with the DEM as follows:

- (6) UST Nos. 003, 004, 005 and 006 were single-walled with no secondary containment.
- (7) On 27 February 2018, the DEM inspected the Facility. The inspection revealed that UST Nos. 003, 004, 005 and 006 were still in use.
- (8) On 15 March 2018, UST Nos. 003, 004, 005 and 006 were removed from the ground and permanently closed.

D. Violation

Based on the foregoing facts, the Director has reasonable grounds to believe that you have violated the following statutes and/or regulations:

- (1) **R.I. Gen. Laws §46-12-3(21)** – requiring that single-walled USTs and product pipelines installed before 8 May 1985 no longer remain in use after 22 December 2017.
- (2) **UST Regulations, Rule 8.04(A) [recently amended to Part 1.10D.1.a]** – requiring owners/operators of single-walled USTs and product pipelines installed before 8 May 1985 to permanently close the USTs and product pipelines by 22 December 2017.

E. Penalty

- (1) Pursuant to R.I. Gen. Laws Section 42-17.6-2, the following administrative penalty, as more specifically described in the attached penalty summary and worksheets, is hereby ASSESSED, jointly and severally, against each named respondent:

- (2) The proposed administrative penalty is calculated pursuant to the Rhode Island Code of Regulations titled *Rules and Regulations for Assessment of Administrative Penalties (250-RICR-130-00-1)* and must be paid to the DEM within 30 days of your receipt of the NOV. Payment shall be in the form of a certified check, cashier's check or money order made payable to the "General Treasury - Water & Air Protection Program Account" and shall be forwarded to the DEM Office of

Compliance and Inspection, 235 Promenade Street, Suite 220, Providence, Rhode Island 02908-5767.

- (3) Penalties assessed against Respondents in the NOV are penalties payable to and for the benefit of the State of Rhode Island and are not compensation for actual pecuniary loss.

F. Right to Administrative Hearing

- (1) Pursuant to R.I. Gen. Laws Chapters 42-17.1, 42-17.6, 42-17.7 and 42-35, each named respondent is entitled to request a hearing before the DEM's Administrative Adjudication Division regarding the allegations, orders and/or penalties set forth in Sections B through E above. All requests for hearing MUST:

- (a) Be in writing. See R.I. Gen. Laws Sections 42-17.1-2(21)(i) and 42-17.6-4(b);
- (b) Be **RECEIVED** by the DEM's Administrative Adjudication Division, at the following address, within 20 days of your receipt of the NOV. See R.I. Gen. Laws Sections 42-17.1-2(21)(i) and 42-17.7-9:

- (c) Indicate whether you deny the alleged violations and/or whether you believe that the administrative penalty is excessive. See R.I. Gen. Laws Section 42-17.6-4(b); **AND**
 - (d) State clearly and concisely the specific issues which are in dispute, the facts in support thereof and the relief sought or involved, if any. See Part 1.7B of the Rhode Island Code of Regulations titled *Rules and Regulations for the Administrative Adjudication Division (250-RICR-10-00-1)*.
- (2) A copy of each request for hearing must also be forwarded to:

- (3) Each named respondent has the right to be represented by legal counsel at all administrative proceedings relating to this matter.

- (4) Each respondent must file a separate and timely request for an administrative hearing before the DEM's Administrative Adjudication Division as to each violation alleged in the written NOV. If any respondent fails to request a hearing in the above-described time or manner regarding any violation set forth herein, then this NOV shall automatically become a Final Compliance Order enforceable in Superior Court as to that respondent and/or violation and any associated administrative penalty proposed in the NOV shall be final as to that respondent. See R.I. Gen. Laws Sections 42-17.1-2(21)(i) and (vi) and 42-17.6-4(b) and (c).
- (5) Failure to comply with the NOV may subject each respondent to additional civil and/or criminal penalties.
- (6) An original signed copy of the NOV is being forwarded to the City of Providence, Rhode Island, wherein the Property is located, to be recorded in the Office of Land Evidence Records pursuant to R.I. Gen. Laws Chapter 34-13 and Section 42-17.1-2 (31), as amended.
- (7) The NOV does not preclude the Director from taking any additional enforcement action nor does it preclude any other local, state, or federal governmental entities from initiating enforcement actions based on the acts or omissions described herein.

<p>Taken from Part 1.10A.1.b of the Rhode Island Code of Regulations titled <i>Rules and Regulations for Assessment of Administrative Penalties (250-RICR-130-00-1)</i></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> (1) The extent to which the act or failure to act was out of compliance: Respondents failed to permanently close UST Nos. 003, 004, 005 and 006 by the 22 December 2017 deadline and continued to operate the UST systems in violation of the law and the UST Regulations. The operation of single-walled USTs beyond 22 December 2017 is prohibited. Single-walled USTs and pipelines present a threat to the environment and public health and safety as there is no secondary containment to prevent releases of petroleum products and hazardous materials directly to the subsurface. Failure to comply increases the likelihood of a release of the regulated substance to the environment and the resultant threats to groundwater resources and public health and safety. (2) Environmental conditions: The Facility is located in a densely developed area with numerous potential vapor receptors including commercial and residential structures and underground utilities. The Facility is located in a GB groundwater classification zone, which are groundwater resources designated as unsuitable for drinking water use without treatment. Upon information and belief, there are no drinking water supply wells in the vicinity. The USTs were installed within 260 feet of a groundwater reservoir. The USTs were installed within 200 feet of the Woonasquatucket River and within its watershed. (3) Amount of the pollutant: Considered, but not utilized for this calculation. (4) Toxicity or nature of the pollutant: The volatile nature of gasoline presents both a potential public health hazard (due to potential inhalation of benzene) and a potential public safety hazard (due to the potential for explosion). Gasoline can cause significant soil and groundwater contamination if released to the environment. Certain petroleum constituents are potentially harmful to human health and safety and the environment. (5) Duration of the violation: Approximately 4 months – the violation occurred from 22 December 2017 to 15 March 2018. (6) Areal extent of the violation: Considered, but not utilized for this calculation.

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- (7) **Whether the person took reasonable and appropriate steps to prevent and/or mitigate the non-compliance:** Respondents failed to take reasonable and appropriate steps to prevent the non-compliance by permanently closing the USTs by 22 December 2017. The tanks also remained in use until the tanks were removed from the ground. The DEM issued PMG NORTHEAST LLC written notices on 23 September 2016 and 4 April 2017 informing it of the required actions to comply with the law and the UST regulations. To mitigate the noncompliance, the USTs were removed from the ground and permanently closed.
- (8) **Whether the person has previously failed to comply with any regulations, order, statute, license, permit or approval issued or adopted by the Department, or any law which the Department has the authority or responsibility to enforce:** Considered, but not utilized for this calculation.
- (9) **The degree of willfulness or negligence, including but not limited to, how much control the violator had over the occurrence of the violation and whether the violation was foreseeable:** Negligence is attributable to Respondents for their failure to comply with the requirements set forth in the law and the UST Regulations. Respondents, as owners and operators of the Facility, had full control over the occurrence of the violation.
- (10) **Any other factor(s) that may be relevant in determining the amount of a penalty:** Considered, but not utilized for this calculation.
