Site Investigation Report Addendum Trestle Trail Bike Path Trestle Trail Right-of-Way, Coventry

Specific Comments

1. Site Plan - Coventry Auto Body

The site plan for the Coventry Auto Body area consists of seven soil sampling locations; however, soil sampling location CAB-1 is identified twice on the site figure, one on the eastern edge of the samples and one on the western edge. Please update this site plan to accurately depict the soil sampling location of CAB-1 and any other soil sampling locations that may have been located in the vicinity of Coventry Auto Body.

2. Appendices

The laboratory analytical data sheets were not included in this Site Investigation Report Addendum (Addendum). Please submit these analytical reports for each soil sample that was analyzed.

3. Remedial Alternatives

This Addendum did not include remedial alternatives in accordance with Rule 7.04 Development of Remedial Alternatives of the Remediation Regulations. Rule 7.04 states "The Site Investigation Report shall contain a section proposing remedial alternatives. It should be clear in this section which of these alternatives is most preferable." The Department cannot issue a Program Letter, and the Responsible Party cannot conduct post-site investigation public notice, until the Department offers its concurrence with a proposed remedial alternative.

4. Certification Requirements

In accordance with **Rule 7.05 Certification Requirements** of the <u>Remediation Regulations</u> a certification certificate by an authorized representative that prepared the report and by the Performing Party is required. Please submit a certification by the Performing Party responsible for the submittal of the Site Investigation Report.

5. Internet Repository

At the request of the public during a public meeting held on July 12, 2011, the Department established an internet repository for the Trestle Trail Bike Path. Please submit hard copies and electronic copies of all future correspondences, reports and plans to be posted on the Department website.
