T. Miozzi

The T. Miozzi plant has been operating at its current location since July 2006. The T. Miozzi plant's operations are regulated by the DEM under the terms and conditions of a minor source permit issued pursuant to the DEM's Air Pollution Control Regulation No. 9. The initial minor source permit was issued on June 27, 2006.

Pasteryak Asphalt

The Pasteryak plant has been operating at its current location, under the current ownership, since July 2011. Prior to that, the plant was idle for approximately 18 months. Before that, it had been operated by different entities since June 1977. The Pasteryak plant's operations are regulated by the terms and conditions of a minor source permit issued pursuant to the DEM's Air Pollution Control Regulation No. 9 and an Emissions Cap issued pursuant to the DEM's Air Pollution Control Regulation No. 29. The initial minor source permit and initial Emissions Cap were issued on June 22, 1977 and July 3, 1996, respectively, and were transferred to Pasteryak in July 2011.

The air contaminants of concern from these plants are smoke and other by-products from the combustion process and dust emissions from the dryers. The dust from the dryers is captured in baghouses.
