This resource guide is intended to provide hoteliers with information on the most important topics for greening lodging properties. It is a combination of internet-base documents, websites and programs that hoteliers can join. It is certainly not encyclopedic, but it does provide background information that enables hoteliers to understand green ideas and opportunities, and how to get started with implementation.

The categorization of articles is imperfect, because some products and services provide multiple benefits. For example, I could have place ozone laundry under energy efficiency, water use reduction or toxic use reduction.

As you will see, many of the articles are from Green Lodging News. I am very grateful to its editor, Glenn Hasek, for advancing the field of green hospitality, and for providing such a great resource for the world to use.

Building Operator Certification Training Program, <u>www.theboc.info/</u>, "is a nationally recognized training and certification program for building operators offering improved job skills and more comfortable, energy-efficient facilities." Hotel managers who sent their engineers to these programs tell me that they have reduced energy and water use substantially, and have gained insights into valuable capital purchases that multiply this impact.

"Individuals certified at BOC Level I have demonstrated competence to review the major components and maintenance requirements of their facility's electrical, HVAC, and lighting systems and to develop an energy consumption profile for the facility. Individuals certified at BOC Level II have demonstrated competency in assessing their facility's preventive maintenance program and optimizing equipment operation for energy efficiency."

The Level I course consists of eight, one-day classes held over three months for \$1,375. The Level II course also costs \$1,375.

Combined Heat and Power: CHP, also known as cogeneration, occurs when hotels generate their own electricity and use the waste heat—usually to heat their water. It's a large capital expense, but often has a favorable ROI, particularly when hotels receive incentives to install it. See
