What is Considered Waste?

 - Economic
 - Efficiency
- Respond to customer/client desires
 - 'Green' practices are meaningful to customers
- Respond to market pressures
 - 'Green' Wave

Determining Your Waste Stream

- Waste Assessment
 - General overview of stream
 - Low time investment, general data
- Waste Audit
 - Piece by piece sort and weigh of stream
 - Heavy time investment, high quality data

Seeing Green by Recycling

- Certain recyclables are literally a hot commodity:
 - Cardboard
 - Aluminum

Glass, while highly recyclable, has <u>no value</u> as a commodity unless color separated and delivered whole
