NOTICE OF VIOLATION

A. Introduction

Pursuant to Sections 42-17.1-2(21) and 42-17.6-3 of the Rhode Island General Laws, as amended, ("R.I. Gen. Laws") you are hereby notified that the Director of the Department of Environmental Management (the "Director" of "DEM") has reasonable grounds to believe that the above-named party ("Respondent") has violated certain statutes and/or administrative regulations under DEM's jurisdiction.

B. Facts

- (1) The facility is located at 319 Providence Street in the town of West Warwick, Rhode Island (the "Facility") and is operated by the Respondent.
- (2) The Facility is (and has been) subject to the DEM's *Air Pollution Control Regulations*, including but not limited to Regulation No. 9 entitled, "*Air Pollution Control Permits*".
- (3) On 29 February 2012, the DEM received from Aegis Energy Services, Inc. on behalf of the Respondent an application for a general permit for a distributed generator to the DEM. The application was for a natural gas fired generator with a maximum heat input capacity of 948,600 British thermal units per hour ("BTU/hour").
- (4) In correspondence dated 3 January 2013 and 8 May 2013, the DEM informed the Respondent that the generator was not eligible for a general permit and that the Respondent must submit a minor source permit application.
- (5) On 23 July 2013, the DEM inspected the Facility. The inspection revealed that the generator was installed and operable. The DEM determined that the generator was installed in January 2013 with an initial startup in April 2013.
- (6) As of the date of this Notice of Violation ("NOV"), the Respondent has failed to submit a minor source permit application for the generator to the DEM.

C. Violation

Based on the foregoing facts, the Director has reasonable grounds to believe that you have violated the following statutes and/or regulations:

- (1) **DEM's Air Pollution Control ("APC") Regulation 9.2.1** (a) prohibiting the construction, installation or modification of any stationary source without obtaining a minor source permit from DEM for each proposed installation or modification described in DEM's APC Regulation 9.3.1.
- (2) **DEM's APC Regulation 9.3.1 (b)** requiring a minor source permit for any distributed generator with a heat input capacity of 350,000 BTUs or more per hour.
- (3) **DEM's APC Regulation 2.2** prohibiting the operation of an emission unit without obtaining the required permit.

D. Order

Based upon the violations alleged above and pursuant to R.I. Gen. Laws section 42-17.1-2(21), you are hereby ORDERED to:

- (1) Within thirty (30) days of receipt of this NOV, submit to the DEM a complete minor source permit application for the generator in accordance with the DEM's APC Regulation No. 9 and associated permit application fees in accordance with the DEM's *Rules and Regulations Governing the Establishment of Various Fees*.
- (2) Within thirty (30) days of receipt of any correspondence from the DEM regarding deficiencies in the minor source permit application, correct all deficiencies and resubmit the permit application to the DEM.

E. Penalty

(1) Pursuant to R.I. Gen. Laws Section 42-17.6-2, the following administrative penalty, as more specifically described in the attached penalty summary and worksheets, is hereby ASSESSED, jointly and severally, against each named respondent:

Five Thousand Dollars (\$ 5,000.00)

(2) The proposed administrative penalty is calculated pursuant to the DEM's *Rules* and *Regulations for Assessment of Administrative Penalties*, as amended, and must be paid to the DEM within thirty (30) days of your receipt of NOV. Payment shall be in the form of a certified check, cashiers check or money order made payable to the "General Treasury - Water & Air Protection Program Account," and shall be forwarded to the DEM Office of Compliance and Inspection, 235 Promenade Street, Suite 220, Providence, Rhode Island 02908-5767.

- (3) Penalties assessed against the Respondent in this NOV are penalties payable to and for the benefit of the State of Rhode Island and are not compensation for actual pecuniary loss.
- (4) If any violation alleged herein shall continue, then each day during which the violation occurs or continues shall constitute a separate offense and the penalties and/or costs for that violation shall continue to accrue in the manner set forth in the attached penalty summary and worksheets. The accrual of additional penalties and costs shall be suspended if the Director determines that reasonable efforts have been made to comply promptly with this NOV.

F. Right to Administrative Hearing

- (1) Pursuant to R.I. Gen. Laws Chapters 42-17.1, 42-17.6, 42-17.7 and 42-35, each named respondent is entitled to request a hearing before the DEM Administrative Adjudication Division regarding the allegations, orders and/or penalties set forth in Sections B through D above. All requests for hearing MUST:
 - (a) Be in writing. <u>See</u> R.I. Gen. Laws Sections 42-17.1-2(21)(i) and 42-17.6-4(b);
 - (b) Be **RECEIVED** by DEM's Administrative Adjudication Division, at the following address, within twenty (20) days of your receipt of this NOV. <u>See</u> R.I. Gen. Laws Sections 42-17.1-2(21)(i) and 42-17.7-9:

- (c) Indicate whether you deny the alleged violations and/or whether you believe that the administrative penalty is excessive. See R.I. Gen. Laws Section 42-17.6-4(b); AND
- (d) State clearly and concisely the specific issues which are in dispute, the facts in support thereof and the relief sought or involved, if any. <u>See</u> Rule 7.00(b) of the DEM Administrative Rules of Practice and Procedure for the Administrative Adjudication Division of Environmental Matters.
- (2) A copy of each request for hearing must also be forwarded to:

(3) Each named respondent has the right to be represented by legal counsel at all administrative proceedings relating to this matter.

- (4) Each respondent must file a separate and timely request for an administrative hearing before DEM's Administrative Adjudication Division as to each violation alleged in the written NOV. If any respondent fails to request a hearing in the above-described time or manner with regard to any violation set forth herein, then this NOV shall automatically become a Final Compliance Order enforceable in Superior Court as to that respondent and/or violation and any associated administrative penalty proposed in the NOV shall be final as to that respondent. See R.I. Gen. Laws Sections 42-17.1-2(21)(i) and (v) and 42-17.6-4(b) and (c).
- (5) Failure to comply with this NOV may subject each respondent to additional civil and/or criminal penalties.
- (6) This NOV does not preclude the Director from taking any additional enforcement action nor does it preclude any other local, state, or federal governmental entities from initiating enforcement actions based on the acts or omissions described herein.
