**PUBLIC NOTICE OF JOINT PUBLIC HEARING**

**FY 2016 Intended Use Plan, FY 2016 Project Priority List &  
RI Clean Water State Revolving Fund Affordability Criteria**

The Executive Director of the Rhode Island Infrastructure Bank (RIIB) proposes the adoption of the federal fiscal year 2016 Intended Use Plan (IUP). The IUP identifies water pollution abatement projects to be funded by the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) with the federal fiscal year 2015 capitalization grant awarded under provisions of Title VI of the federal Clean Water Act and Chapter 46-12.2 of the General Laws of Rhode Island, 1956, as amended, and

The Director of the RI Department of Environmental Management (DEM) proposes promulgation of the state fiscal year 2016 Project Priority List (PPL) developed pursuant to "Rules and Regulations for the Priority Determination System for Federal and State Assistance to Local Governmental Units for Construction of Water Pollution Abatement Projects", dated April, 1998, to meet the requirements of Title VI of the Federal Clean Water Act, as amended, and Chapter 46-12.2 of the General Laws of Rhode Island, 1956, as amended,

Both the Executive Director and Director propose the adoption of the RI CWSRF Affordability Criteria in accordance with the provisions of Title VI of the federal Clean Water Act as amended.

Therefore, notice is hereby given in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 42-35 of the General Laws of Rhode Island of 1956, as amended, that the Director of DEM and the Executive Director of RIIB will hold a joint public hearing on both of the abovementioned topics in the Conference Room of RIIB in the Foundry Complex, Suite 119, 235 Promenade Street, Providence RI on Monday, December 21, 2015 at 1:00 p.m. at which time and place all persons will be heard. The building is accessible to the handicapped. Persons requesting interpreter services for the hearing impaired must notify the Office of Water Resources at either (401) 222-3961 or TDD (401) 831-5508 within forty-eight (48) hours in advance of the hearing date. The public record will remain open for seven (7) calendar days after the public hearing for the submission of written comments.

DEM and RIIB, in accordance with Section 42-35-3 of the Rhode Island General Laws, as amended, have determined that the proposed IUP, PPL, and Affordability Criteria do not overlap or duplicate other regulatory or statutory provisions, nor will they result in significant adverse economic impact on small businesses or cities and towns.
