



NON-RESIDENT LANDING PERMITS
NEW PERMIT OPPORTUNITIES

1. Purpose:

- A Landing Permit or a valid Rhode Island commercial fishing license with the appropriate fishery endorsement(s), but not both a permit and license, is required to off-load any seafood product legally harvested outside of Rhode Island waters for sale or intended sale in Rhode Island, or to secure a vessel with the seafood products on board to a shoreside facility where the products may be off-loaded for sale or intended sale.

2. Eligibility:

- Any non-resident who holds a valid federal commercial fishing license or permit, or a valid commercial fishing license or permit issued by another state, may obtain one or more of the following new Non-Resident Landing Permits: Non-Restricted Finfish, Shellfish, Crustacean, and Multi-Purpose.
- Any non-resident who holds a valid federal commercial fishing license or permit, or a valid commercial fishing license or permit issued by another state, may obtain a new Non-Resident Restricted Finfish Landing Permit if the applicant can show evidence that their landings under the permit will be charged to the quota of the state in which their vessel is registered or documented, or that the state in which their vessel is registered or documented allows Rhode Island residents to obtain new permits to land against that state's quota for the six restricted finfish species.

3. Available Landing Permits in 2003 for Non-Residents:

(1) Non-Resident Non-Restricted Finfish Landing Permit (\$400)

- This permit allows the holder to land, sell, and/or offer for sale *any non-restricted finfish species*, in accordance with applicable regulations. This non-restricted finfish category includes all finfish species *except scup, summer flounder, black sea bass, tautog, striped bass, and winter flounder*.

(2) Non-Resident Shellfish Landing Permit (\$400)

- This permit allows the holder to land, sell, and/or offer for sale *any shellfish species*, in accordance with applicable regulations.

- (3) **Non-Resident Crustacean Landing Permit (\$400)**
- This permit allows the holder to land, sell, and/or offer for sale *lobsters and any species of crabs*, in accordance with applicable regulations.

- (4) **Non-Resident Multi-Purpose Landing Permit (\$600)**
- This permit allows the holder to land, sell, and/or offer for sale *any marine species or product except restricted finfish species* (i.e., all species and products except scup, summer flounder, black sea bass, tautog, striped bass, and winter flounder), in accordance with applicable regulations.
 - For listing of applicable regulations governing marine species, see DEM's website (www.state.ri.us/dem) and click "topics" and then "marine fisheries"; as well as hand-outs available at DEM's Office of Boat Registration and Licensing.
- (5) **Non-Resident Restricted Finfish Landing Permit (\$400)**
- This permit allows the holder to land, sell, and/or offer for sale *any restricted finfish species*. This restricted finfish category includes and is limited to the following six species: scup, summer flounder, black sea bass, tautog, striped bass, and winter flounder.
 - This permit is only available, as a new permit, for non-residents who can show evidence that their landings under the permit will be charged to the quota of the state in which their vessel is registered or documented, or that the state in which their vessel is registered or documented allows Rhode Island residents to obtain new permits to land against that state's quota for the six restricted finfish species.
 - The \$400 permit fee shall be waived for qualified applicants who also obtain a Non-Resident Multi-Purpose Landing Permit.

4. **When and How to Apply:**

- New landing permits for 2003 will be available anytime after January 1, 2003. Renewals may be obtained beginning December 16, 2002. Applications must be made in person at DEM during regular business hours, or sent to DEM via mail. There is no application deadline associated with landing permits; they may be obtained at any time during the license year.

5. Information to be Provided with each Application:

- Full name
- Age
- Residence address
- Mailing address
- Weight
- Height
- Hair color
- Eye color
- Federal or state commercial fishing license
- Vessel length, displacement, and horsepower
- Documentation and certification relating to the Non-Resident Restricted Finfish Landing Permit requirements, if applying for that permit
- The name of any state or jurisdiction in which the applicant's commercial fishing license and/or permit is currently revoked or suspended
- Driver's License number and state of issuance, or other state-issued photo identification card
- Signature

[Note: Vessel declarations are not required for vessels with landing permits that fish exclusively outside of Rhode Island waters.]
