Application for 100% Permanent Disability Fishing/Combination License

Eligibility Requirements:

Persons with Disability who are 100% Permanently Disabled and are eligible for a Fishing/Combination License, are required to present the ORIGINAL DOCUMENT OF THE FINAL DECISION(S), on agency letterhead, from the appropriate federal agency(ies) that issued the required disability decision(s), i.e., the Social Security Administration or the Department of Veteran Affairs for a fishing license. In addition to the above, for a hunting license the applicant MUST also provide a prior RI or (New for 2016) current or prior OUT OF STATE hunting license (not valid for Archery only license), a hunter safety card from any state, OR AN HONORABLE DISCHARGE (DD-214) and present the ORIGINAL DOCUMENT OF THE FINAL DECISION(S), on agency letterhead, from the appropriate federal agency (ies) that issued the required disability decision(s), i.e., the Social Security Administration or the Department of Veteran Affairs. THIS LICENSE, ONCE ISSUED IS PERMANENT.

Persons with Disability who are 100% Totally Disabled and are eligible for a Fishing/Combination License, are required to present the ORIGINAL DOCUMENT OF THE FINAL DECISION(S), on agency letterhead, from the appropriate federal agency(ies) that issued the required disability decision(s) i.e., the Social Security Administration or the Department of Veteran Affairs for a fishing license. Instead of the above documentation, DEM will accept a current disability beach pass (disability picture ID) from the Parks & Recreation Division/DEM. For a hunting license, the applicant MUST also provide a prior RI hunting license or (New for 2016) a current or prior OUT OF STATE hunting license (not valid for Archery only license), a HUNTER SAFETY CARD from any state, OR AN HONORABLE DISCHARGE (DD-214) and present the ORIGINAL DOCUMENT OF THE FINAL DECISION(S), on agency letterhead, from the appropriate federal agency(ies) that issued the required disability decision(s), i.e., the Social Security Administration or the Department of Veteran Affairs. THIS LICENSE, ONCE ISSUED IS FOR A ONE YEAR PERIOD EXPIRING YEARLY THE LAST DAY OF FEBRUARY. In future years, persons with disabilities must provide the division with the original document of the final decision(s), on agency letterhead, from the appropriate federal agency(ies) that issued the required disability decision(s), i.e., the Social Security Administration or the Department of Veteran Affairs that indicates the continuing nature of the permanent disability.

Veterans: In order to be determined to be eligible for a 100% Permanent Disability Fishing/Combination License, applicants are required to present the ORIGINAL DOCUMENT OF THE FINAL DECISION(S), from the Department of Veteran Affairs for a fishing license. For a hunting license, the applicant MUST also provide a prior RI hunting license or (New for 2016) a current or prior OUT OF STATE hunting license (not valid for Archery only license), a HUNTER SAFETY CARD from any state, OR AN HONORABLE DISCHARGE (DD-214). THIS LICENSE, ONCE ISSUED IS PERMANENT.

**\*\*WARNING**

Rhode Island General Law 20-13-5 **PROHIBITS** the following persons from **PURCHASING** or **POSSESSING** a Hunting License:

- Persons convicted of a crime of violence\*
- Fugitives from Justice
- Anyone declared Mentally Incompetent
- Drug Addicts
- Habitual Drunkards

\* **“Crime of Violence”** shall mean and include any of the following crimes or an attempt to commit any of them; murder, manslaughter, rape, first or second degree sexual assault, first or second degree child molestation, kidnapping, first and second degree arson, mayhem, robbery, burglary, breaking and entering, any felony involving the illegal manufacture, sale or delivery of a controlled substance classified in schedule I or schedule II of **21-28-2.08**, any violation **21-28-4.1** or **21-28-4.01.2** or conspiracy to commit any violation of these statutes, assault with a dangerous weapon, assault or battery involving grave bodily injury, and or assault with intent to commit any offense punishable as a felony; upon conviction of an offense punishable as a felony offense under 12-29-5 (domestic violence).

Penalty is a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine not more than five-hundred dollars (\$500.00) or imprisonment for up to ninety (90) days or both.
