

Draft changes to the Rules and Regulations for Hazardous Waste Management – as of 10/15/04

Used Oil Regulations - (Proposed New Hazardous Waste Management Rule 15.00)

This proposed Rule is intended to provide businesses that generate used (or waste) oil an alternative method for managing their used oil that is less restrictive than managing it as a conventional hazardous waste. After an extensive internal review process the proposed Rule was mailed to the USEPA for review. Some of the key differences between the two regulatory systems are as follows:

<u>Used Oil Generator (only)</u>	<u>Hazardous Waste Generator</u>
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Not required to register w/DEM	Required to register w/DEM
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• May store up to twenty four 55 gallon drums w/o a time limit (1,230 gal.)	May store one 55 gallon drum (per waste stream)
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Must ship excess drums (>10) offsite w/in 180 days of accumulation	Must ship excess drums (>1) offsite w/in 90 days of accumulation
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Not required to provide haz-waste management training to employees	Required to provide haz-waste management training to all employees that handle HW
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Not required to develop a haz-waste contingency plan	Required to develop and maintain a haz-waste contingency plan
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Allowed to burn specification and off-specification used oil onsite as an alternative fuel in burners with <500,000 BTU capacity or to send offsite for burning as an alternative fuel	Not allowed to burn haz-waste onsite
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Allowed to self-transport up to 55 Gallons of used oil per shipment to a used oil burning or processing facility	Not allowed to self-transport
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Not required to ship used oil on a hazardous waste manifest	Required to ship haz-waste using a hazardous waste manifest

Used Oil Temporary Storage Facility

- May store used oil onsite for up to 35 days after obtaining approval from DEM

Used Oil Burning Facility

- May burn specification used oil onsite after notifying DEM for <1,000,000 BTU burners or after obtaining a permit from DEM for 1,000,000 or greater BTU burners

Used Oil Processor/Re-refiner

- Required to apply for and obtain a permit from DEM

Hazardous Waste Transfer facility

May store haz-waste for up to 72 hours after obtaining approval from DEM

Hazardous Waste Incinerator Facility

May burn haz-waste after obtaining a TSD facility permit from the USEPA and must comply with requirements of 40 CFR 265 Subpart O & P

Temporary Storage and Disposal Facility

Required to apply for and obtain a permit from DEM
