# 1. INTRODUCTION OF COMMISSIONERS AND ATTENDEES:

A regular meeting of the Derelict and Abandoned Vessel and Obstruction Removal Commission was called to order at approximately 9:00am on Thursday, January 10, 2019, at the RIDEM Wickford marine base. A quorum was present; the members and attendees introduced themselves.

# 2. PROPOSED MEETING MINUTES REVIEW AND VOTE:

Commissioners reviewed the draft meeting minutes from the September 28, 2018 meeting. There were no comments or revisions. The Chair entertained a MOTION to accept the minutes; Commissioner Goulet MOVED to approved, Commissioner Mills SECONDED the motion. Vote was UNANIMOUS, *Voted <u>5-0 in favor</u>*.

# 3. APPLICATION REVIEW:

- No new applications were received for this period.
- Pending Applications:

The commissioners reviewed an application from the town of North Kingstown. The Chair advised that the vessel in question was a 24-ft. derelict and abandoned sailboat located in a mooring in Wickford Harbor right in the path of the town beach. He advised that there were environmental-hazard concerns associated with the vessel; however, it was never fully determined whether the boat leaked any fuel. The town then got actively involved and secured the boat to help prevent any further threats. The Chair then stated that after he reviewed the application, he felt the town met all the conditions for an award. After discussions concluded, Commissioners scored the matrix. Scores are as follows:

Chair Blanchard went on to state that previous awards had scores between 14.75-20.0 so this award scored well above the approval range. Vote was UNANIMOUS. *Voted* 5-0 *in favor* to award funding to the Town of North Kingstown.

Atty. Hoefsmit advised that the commissioners take another vote so they can move forward to begin the process of filing a claim for reimbursement through the A. G's Office. The Chair then asked if there was a MOTION to approve that Atty. Hoefsmit draft a letter to the A. G's Office. Vote was UNANIMOUS. *Voted 5-0 in favor*.
